



Technoleg Iechyd Cymru Health Technology Wales

Health Technology Wales (Technoleg Iechyd Cymru) has been established to support a strategic, national approach to the identification, appraisal and adoption (including disinvestment) of non-medicine health technologies into health and care settings. This includes medical devices, surgical procedures and a range of other interventions such as psychological therapies and rehabilitation.

HTW, is an independent, arms-length organisation that will deliver authoritative evidence-informed advice about the value for money of non-medicine health technologies to improve patient outcomes for all patients in Wales.

HTW works in three main areas to help create a common understanding of value in NHS Wales and to optimize the use of health interventions:

Identification

- Understanding the needs of patients and clinicians in NHS Wales
- Horizon scanning of technologies that may have a major impact on NHS Wales in the future
- Signposting health technology developers to relevant advice across Wales

Appraisal

- Producing appraisal reports of the evidence for clinical and cost effectiveness, which are reviewed by experts
- Issuing shorter forms of advice to NHS Wales, presenting the best available evidence
- Building capacity to develop skills related to critical appraisal and economic evaluation

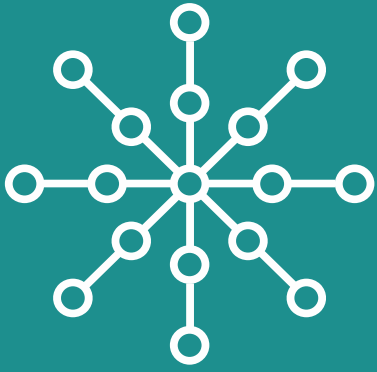
Adoption

- Workshops to share evidence and experiences of using health technologies in NHS Wales to optimize practice
- Monitoring uptake of evidence-informed advice across all health board
- Making recommendations on research priorities

Technoleg Iechyd Cymru Health Technology Wales

Mae Technoleg Iechyd Cymru wedi cael ei sefydlu i gefnogi dull strategol, cenedlaethol o ganfod, arfarnu a mabwysiadu (gan gynnwys dadfudsoddi) technolegau iechyd, nad ydynt yn feddyginiaethau, i leoliadau iechyd a gofal. Gall hyn olygu dyfeisiau meddygol, llawdriniaethau ac amrywiaeth o ymyriadau eraill fel therapïau seicolegol ac adsefydlu.

- Cyfeirio datblygwyr technoleg iechyd at gyngor perthnasol ar draws Cymru

Arfarnu

- Adroddiadau arfarnu o'r dystiolaeth ar gyfer effeithiolrwydd clinigol a chostau, sy'n cael eu hadolygu gan arbenigwyr
- Ffuriau mwy byr o gyngor i GIG Cymru, sy'n cyflwyno'r dystiolaeth orau sydd ar gael
- Adeiladu capasiti i ddatblygu sgiliau sy'n gysylltiedig ag arfarnu tystiolaeth feirniadol a gwerthusiad economaidd

Mabwysiadu

- Gweithdai i rannu tystiolaeth a phrofiad o ddefnyddio technolegau iechyd yng Nghymru i optimeiddio eu defnydd
- Monitro'r defnydd o gyngor sy'n seiliedig ar dystiolaeth ar draws yr holl fyrddau iechyd
- Argymhellion ar flaenoriaethau ymchwil
